CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

Questions submitted to the qualified voters of New Hampshire, February 24, 1976, together with the votes on each question:

(Questions proposed by the 1974 Constitutional Convention)

1. Are you in favor of amending the Constitution to provide that the governor shall have ten days, instead of five, to act on legislation submitted to him, and 'o provide that the governor shall recall the legislature for the sole purpose of reconsidering any bills he has vetoed after it had adjourned and to allow pay and mileage to the legislature at the same rate payable at special sessions?

2. Are you in favor of amending the Constitution to allow the legislature to call itself into special session with customary pay and mileage by a majority vote of each house instead of a two-thirds of each house?

Yes 63,973 No 115,800

3. Are you in favor of amending the Constitution to eliminate the authority of the governor to prorogue (that is, to extend) the recess of the legislature for up to ninety days?

Yes 77,899 No 99,714

4. Are you in favor of amending the Constitution to provide that all legislators, for actual daily attendance on legislative days in regular or special session, shall be compensated at the computed daily rate of the salary established for the lowest grade classified state employee and that the presiding officers shall also be compensated when attending to legislative business on non-legislative days; and that all legislators shall receive mileage payments at the same rate as paid to state employees?

5. Are you in favor of amending the Constitution to provide that when the office of governor is vacant, when the governor determines that he is unwilling or unable to discharge the powers and duties of his office, or when the supreme court upon motion of a majority of the executive council and after hearing determines that the governor is unable to discharge the powers and duties of his office, the senior member of the council shall function as governor?

6. Are you in favor of amending the Constitution to allow district courts to try persons for crimes committed in a county other than the county where the court sits, with the result that the legislature could create district courts containing towns and cities located in more than one county?

DIRECT PRIMARY, 1976

Persons voted for at a primary, who received a plurality of all the votes cast by a party, shall be candidates of that party for the office designated in the ballot. — RSA 56:53.

The direct primary election was held September 14, 1976, with candidates of the Republican and Democratic parties participating.

In the summary immediately following are the full names and residences of the candidates, also their total votes. Then follow tables carrying the vote in detail and giving only the last names of the candidates.

The first tables give by counties the vote for Governor. The next tables give by districts the votes for Representatives in Congress, the votes for Councilors, and the votes for State Senators. Then follow the tables showing the votes for county offices, and recounts after the Primary.
