RECOUNTS AFTER THE PRIMARY

After the Primary, fifteen requests for recounts were received.

Fifteen recounts of ballots were conducted by the Secretary of State on September 25 and 26, 1978; ten recounts were Republican and five were Democratic contests. Two recounts of the ballots cast — Councilor District No. 1, Republican, and Hillsborough County Commissioner District No. 3, Republican, were conceded by Raymond S. Burton and William L. Edwards, respectively, before completion of the count.

One of the recounts resulted in a change in the Strafford County Commissioner race — Democratic. Other changes were in the races for Representative to the General Court in Dover Ward 2 — Republican, and Representative to the General Court in Manchester Ward 6 — Democratic.

The other recounts did not result in a change of nominees.

The result of the write-in votes for Representative to the General Court in Cheshire County District No. 11 was a tie, which was won by Daniel A. Eaton. The recount of this district ended in a tie, broken by drawing lots, and again Daniel A. Eaton won the tie.
