#### RECOUNTS AFTER THE GENERAL ELECTION

In this chapter may be found a brief description of the recounts of ballots held by the Secretary of State after the General Election of

November 2, 1976.

In all, eighteen recounts were conducted: — one for State Senator District No. 16, fifteen for Representatives, one for Supervisor of the Checklist, and one for Moderator. The recounts were held November 15, 16, 17, and 18, 1976, in the Drill Hall at the National Guard Armory, Concord. As a result of the recounts, there were no changes of candidates.

Below, in the first column are the figures as officially returned to the Secretary of State following the election. The second column contains the recount figures. The names of the persons elected are designated

by asterisks.

#### RECOUNTS

On November 26, 1976, the Governor and Council voted to accept petitions to recount the ballots cast on Question No. 3, the proposed amendment relative to annual sessions of the Legislature, submitted by Aileen G. Katz, President, League of Women Voters, et al.; and Question No. 5, the proposed amendment to provide that a town, ward, or unincorporated place may be divided into two or more representative districts, submitted by Norwood Keeney, of Hudson, et al.; which questions were proposed to the voters of New Hampshire at the November 2, 1976 election, and ordered the Secretary of State to recount said ballots.

The recounts were held January 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 24, 25, 26, and 27, 1977, in the Drill Hall at the National Guard Amory, Concord. Neither question received the required two-third votes of the qualified voters present and voting upon the said questions.\*

#### Question No. 3

Are you in favor of amending the Constitution to provide for annual sessions of the legislature and to allow mileage payments for actual attendance for a maximum of ninety legislative days per biennium?

#### Question No. 5

Are you in favor of amending the Constitution to provide that a town, ward, or unincorporated place may be divided into two or more representative districts if requested by a referendum in such town, ward, or place?

\*The ballots from Mason, Newmarket, and Nottingham, totaling 2730, could not be located for recount purposes, and during the recount the original figures as reported to this office were used, in accordance with the Supreme Court opinion.

Be it known that I, Meldrim Thomson, Jr., Governor of the State of New Hampshire, in obedience to the request of the Constitutional Convention holden, at Concord. the second Wednesday of May, 1974, and the 1975 General Court, do hereby proclaim to the people of this State that the Constitution of New Hampshire is amended as provided for in Questions No. 2, 6, 7, and 8, which were submitted by said Constitutional Convention and the 1975 General Court to the qualified voters of the State at the meetings held in the several towns, city wards, and places in this State, on the Tuesday next following the first Monday in November, 1976.

The alteration and amendments in said Constitution covered by these questions have been approved and adopted, and the Constitution is thus amended by the suffrages of more than two-thirds of the qualified voters present at the said meetings, and voting upon the said questions.

Given under my hand and the seal of said State, at the Council Chambers, this 24th day of November, A.D., 1976, and of the Independence of the United States of America, the two hundred and first.
