### RECOUNTS AFTER THE GENERAL ELECTION

In this chapter may be found a brief description of the recounts of ballots held by the Secretary of State after the general election of November 3, 1970.

On November 13, 1970, the Governor and Council voted to accept a petition to recount the ballots cast on Question No. 3, the proposed amendment relative to annual sessions as proposed to the voters of New Hampshire at the November 3, 1970 election, as submitted by Representative John M. Bednar of Hudson, et al., and ordered the Secretary of State to recount said ballots.

The recount was held November 23 and 24, 1970, and Question No. 3 did not receive the required two-thirds votes of the qualified voters present and voting upon the said question.

The following figures are the result of the recount on Question No. 3:

#### Yes 124,078

#### No 62,812

Below, in the first column are the figures as officially returned to the Secretary of State following the election. The second column contains the recount figures.

In all, fourteen recounts were conducted: State Senator, District No. 8; ten for Representatives, two for Supervisors, and one for Moderator.

As a result of the recount, there were no changes of candidates.
